

California Proposition 65 Statement (OEHHA)

Dear valued customer,

California's Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986 (officially known as Proposition 65, or Prop 65), was enacted as a ballot initiative in November 1986. The proposition protects the state's drinking water sources from being contaminated with chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm, and requires businesses to inform Californians about exposures to such chemicals. In line with Proposition 65, California's Office of Environmental Hazard Assessment (OEHHA) maintains a list of chemicals known to the state to cause cancer or reproductive toxicity, which can be accessed on their website. https://oehha.ca.gov/proposition-65

To implement the law, the State of California has published a list of chemicals suspected of being carcinogenic or reproductively toxic.

The last updated Proposition 65 list of Dec., 2023 contains more than 1000 substances. https://oehha.ca.gov/proposition-65/chemicals
