



DECLARATION: Trichlorethylen (TCE), Perchlorethylen (PCE) und Carbon Tetrachloride (CTC) REPORTING UNDER TSCA

The United States Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA) is a federal regulation that allows the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to comprehensively manage chemicals in U.S. Commerce.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) issued new substance bans under Section 6(a) of the Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA) for trichlorethylene (TCE) and perchlorethylene (PCE) on December 17 and 18, 2024. The regulations come into force on January 16 and 17, 2025 (with corresponding transition periods).

Additionally, on December 18, 2024, EPA issued a rule banning some uses of carbon tertrachloride (CTC) that have already been discontinued and establishing robust workplace protections, including a workplace chemical protection program and mandatory controls, for uses that are not prohibited, adopted to minimize the unreasonable risk to human health. The regulation came into force on January 17, 2025. Carbon tetrachloride (CTC) is not listed under the REACH regulation, but is classified as a suspected carcinogen and is regulated in some regulations relating to occupational safety and transport.
